Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

This past Tuesday, we celebrated the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. We will celebrate the Feast of the Queenship of Mary this coming Tuesday. The Feast of the Queenship of Mary is celebrated on August 22, exactly one week after the Feast of the Assumption, which is celebrated on August 15. The connection between these two feasts is deeply rooted in Catholic theology and tradition, and the timing is not coincidental.

The Assumption of Mary: The Feast of the Assumption commemorates God taking the Virgin Mary's body and soul into Heaven at the end of her earthly life. This dogma was defined by Pope Pius XII in 1950, and it is a celebration of Mary's unique role in salvation history and God's unique gift to her.

The Queenship of Mary: The Feast of the Queenship of Mary celebrates Mary's role as Queen of Heaven and Earth. Pope Pius XII established this feast in 1954 with the encyclical "Ad Caeli Reginam." In this document, he explained the theological basis for Mary's queenship and its connection to her Assumption.

The link between these two feasts is found in Mary's unique role as the Mother of God (Theotokos) and her cooperation in God's plan of salvation. Her Assumption into Heaven is seen as a natural precursor to her being crowned as Queen. Theologically, Mary's Queenship is understood in relation to Christ's kingship. Since Christ is King of all creation, and Mary is His Mother, she shares in a unique way in His royalty. Her Assumption into Heaven is seen as her being taken up to her royal throne, where she intercedes for all humanity.

The Apostolic Exhortation "Marialis Cultus," by Pope Paul VI, highlights this connection:

"The Solemnity of the Assumption is prolonged in the celebration of the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary, which occurs seven days later. On this occasion, we contemplate her who, seated beside the King of ages, shines forth as Queen and intercedes as Mother." (6) Mary's dual role as both a majestic Queen and a loving Mother is not unrelated, but is intimately connected by her maternal intercession for us, her children on earth. These feasts reflect the understanding of Mary as the New Eve, intimately associated with her Son, the New Adam, in the work of redemption. Her Assumption and Queenship are seen as the fulfillment of her unique role in the economy of salvation. It is a liturgical expression of the Church's understanding of Mary's exalted position, intimately united with her Son, Jesus Christ, in the heavenly kingdom. By celebrating the Assumption and the Queenship of Mary in close succession, the Church invites us to reflect on the mystery of Mary's participation in the glory of Christ and her continuing intercession for the Church on earth. Let us pray the glorious mysteries of the Rosary this week, and with Mary our Mother, reflect closely on these last two mysteries of the Rosary. - Fr. Peter Do, OP
