



Dear Parishioners:

The weather this past week was noticeably cooler than the previous week's triple digit temperatures. You may remember receiving a push notification to your cellular device prompted by the State of Oregon that looked something like below:



I thought to myself sarcastically, "Oh, how nice. Holy Mother Government is looking out for me."

Then I got to thinking how if only the faithful knew how much Holy Mother Church is looking out for us. She makes available to us the sacraments – those opportunities to encounter God and His abundance of graces - most especially in the Sacraments of Confession and Holy Communion. They are available every day. Even when there is inclement weather. The emergency alert that we receive when we are in need of them is hardwired in us. But it doesn't appear to us on our phones, TVs, or computer screens. Rather, it pings from within.

It's called guilt.

And as Catholics, we are REALLY good at experiencing and discerning guilt. While it may not manifest in physical sweating, we can experience in ourselves a certain spiritual sweating. When our soul is in peril, we know it. There is an uneasiness in us when we recognize we have sinned, when we are conscious of having committed some wrong that needs to be righted – or at least forgiven.

So consider this: There is always a cool place, a refuge, a shelter from the world where we can return to and commune with God. We have access to it today, tonight, tomorrow, and indeed every day of the year. I speak of the confessional box.

The Church reminds us that we should be going to Confession at least once a year. If it's been a long time since your last Confession, come on back. We have a generous schedule of hours for this great sacrament of mercy. Moreover, there really ought to be no shame when we confess our sins. The only shame is not making full use of it.

And if you get me on the other side of the screen, I promise I'll try not to make you sweat.
