Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

In December, the theme of waiting and preparing for the Lord's coming is emphasized throughout the first 24 days of this month. We should prepare to celebrate Christmas, the mystery of the Incarnation, by anticipating the birth of the Savior. Don't let the hustle and bustle of shopping, social gatherings, and company celebrations overshadow the meaning of this holy season. We must keep Advent holy with eager anticipation of God's coming by heeding John the Baptist's call to repentance (cf. Mark 1:1-8). That means turning away from sin and "making straight the paths" to receive the graces of this season. There are several meaningful ways that we can prepare spiritually and emotionally for the celebration of Christ's birth. Here are some traditional practices and ideas:

Prayer: Dedicate time each day for prayer and reflection. Contemplate our God's extraordinary love and humility in the flesh and in the womb of the Virgin Mary. You can use Advent prayers, such as the "O Antiphons," as part of your daily prayer routine. Join the friars for Solemn Vespers according to the ancient Dominican Rite. Starting December 2nd, this liturgy will be held on the first Saturday of every month at 4 pm. Also, you can also join the friars for Lauds (morning prayer) after the 7 am Mass.

Advent Wreath: Lighting an Advent wreath candle is a beautiful tradition. Each candle represents a different theme or virtue (Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love), and you can light them successively each week as a symbol of increasing anticipation.

Scripture Reading: Read and meditate on the Bible passages related to the birth of Jesus, such as the prophecies in the Old Testament and the Gospel accounts of the Nativity. This will help you connect with the significance of the season. Acts of Charity: Like Mary who assisted her cousin Elizabeth, consider donating to the St. Nicholas Christmas Tree, or volunteer to assist in delivering holiday food boxes and gifts. This reflects the spirit of giving and selflessness that Christmas represents.

Confession and Repentance: Take time for self-examination and reconciliation with God. The Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) is a significant part of preparing your heart for Christmas. Confession times are available weekdays from 11am-noon, and a half hour before the weekend Masses.

Fasting and Abstinence: Fasting or abstaining from certain foods and drinks during Advent is a way to prepare spiritually. This practice helps to cultivate the virtue of temperance.

Advent Retreat: Consider participating in the parish Advent Day retreat offered by Fr. William Dillard on Saturday, December 9th, from 8 am until 4 pm. The theme will be the Eucharist and Reconciliation.

Spend Time in Silence: Amidst the hustle and bustle of the holiday season, find moments of silence and solitude for reflection and prayer. It can help you to center your thoughts

on the true meaning of Christmas.

Remember that the goal of Advent is to prepare our hearts and minds to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ. Let us also ask for Mother Mary's intercession. She waited for the day of the Savior's birth with a more fervent longing than anyone else. Mary's preparation was perfect in every way. Let us strive to prepare our souls better by embracing her earnest spirit of prayer with a pure heart and wholehearted obedience to God's divine will.

ST. NICHOLAS CHRISTMAS TREE

THE RORATE CAELI MASS is a traditional Advent devotion wherein the Mass of the Blessed Virgin Mary for Advent is offered just before dawn. On December 9 and 16 this Mass will be celebrated according to the Dominican Rite at 6:00 AM. The Mass takes its title, Rorate Caeli, from the first words of the Introit, which are from Isaiah 45:8: "Rorate, caeli, desuper, et nubes..." (Drop down dew, ye heavens, from above, and let the clouds rain the just: let the earth be opened and bud forth a Savior.) The Rorate Mass is lit only by candlelight. Because it is a votive Mass in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary, white vestments are worn instead of Advent violet. In the dimly lit setting, priests and faithful prepare to honor the Light of the world, Who is soon to be born, and offer praise to God for the gift of Our Lady. As the

Mass proceeds and sunrise approaches, the church becomes progressively brighter, illumined by the sun as our Faith is illumined by Christ.
