Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

Everyone who has the experience of getting that longed-for gift at Christmas knows the experience of getting a good that they desire. They therefore know the experience of joy, because we experience joy when we obtain a good we desire.

I remember as a child in the 1990s wanting a PlayStation, because I used to play it in Costco while my father was shopping for groceries. That Christmas of 1998 I did get a PlayStation along with the latest game: NHL 1999. I rejoiced when I first saw the logo through the wrapping paper because I knew I had received the good that I desired.

Despite the joys of giving and receiving material goods, there are spiritual goods that the Christ-child offers us this season.

We Christians believe that Jesus Christ was born for the salvation of all people. We believe that Jesus is the prophesied Messiah that reconciles all nations to God and brings about the universal peace and happiness that humanity has desired. That reconciliation has been taking place throughout history in the Church, that place where the coming Kingdom of God already breaks into history. That Kingdom of God, already present in the world through the workings of Christ in the Holy Spirit, comes to each of us this season.

Even more than a child rejoicing at receiving its longed-for gift, we will experience joy when we really receive those spiritual goods that we long for through desire. We therefore need to prepare ourselves to desire and rejoice at obtaining these spiritual gifts.

We prepare ourselves to desire these spiritual goods when we work to detach ourselves from an excessive love of worldly pleasures and goods. Nothing prevents a soul from desiring spiritual goods more than an excessive attachment to worldly pleasures. Freedom from such attachments gives us a freedom for enjoying the spiritual goods that God offers.

Let us then prepare for Christmas joy by training ourselves to desire the goods that God offers by undertaking works of prayer, penance, and almsgiving. Let us learn to desire spiritual goods with a child-like expectation.

SOLEMNITY OF MARY, THE MOTHER OF GOD

Please note that Monday, January 1st is the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God. It is not a holy day of obligation this year, but it will still be celebrated at all the Masses on January 1st, and the 5:30 PM Mass on Sunday, December 31st will be a Vigil Mass for Mary, Mother of God, followed by Exposition until midnight. Of course, attending the 5:30 PM Mass on Sunday still fulfills your Sunday obligation, even if

the Mass itself is for the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, and not The Holy Family.

FIRST-CLASS RELIC OF ST. ELIZABETH ANN SETON

On Thursday, January 4 at the noon Mass, there will be a blessing available with a first-class relic of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (1774-1821), the first citizen born in the United States to be canonized (by Pope Paul VI in 1975). Those who would like to receive the blessing may approach the altar rail when the priest indicates – it will be at the end of Mass but before Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament.
