

#### Dear Parishioners:

There is a wonderful pious practice that many at Holy Rosary practice that I want to let everyone know about. It's important to know about it even if you don't practice it yourself for some good reason. This is the practice of praying in preparation before Mass begins and praying a prayer of thanksgiving following Mass. This is a wonderful practice that I recommend to everyone.

Why does this custom exist?

As you are probably aware, sometimes when we come to Mass it takes a while to settle into the mood of worship. If we arrive early and take some time to set aside earthly cares by talking to God and asking for him to come into your heart and prepare your mind for the sacred liturgy, this practice does wonders for preparing one's disposition towards and intention for the Mass. In the back of the Roman Missal used by the priest there are a series of prayers for him to prepare himself for Mass in a similar way. Particularly the prayer before Mass by St. Thomas Aquinas is well suited for anyone, priest and people alike.

Also, following Mass, instead of rushing to the car to or to the hall to grab a donut, it's good to thank God for the gift that he has given us in being able to share in his sacred mysteries, to worship him and for the grace that he offers us through faithfully assisting at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. This is different than one's prayer following Holy Communion because, as you know, we don't assist at Mass simply so that we can receive Holy Communion. We principally come to Mass to worship God and if we are so disposed then we may receive Holy Communion at Mass. So, this time after Mass is an opportunity to offer him our gratitude. Again, the prayer of St. Thomas Aquinas after Mass is a great prayer for everyone.

This means that there are three opportunities for private prayer in conjunction with the Mass. The first is to arrive early enough to kneel down in prayer to prepare ourselves for the act of worship. The second is following the reception of Holy Communion (my personal favorite is Padre Pio's prayer following the reception of Holy Communion), and the third is offering thanksgiving after Mass.

At the very least we should be aware of these practices even if we are unable to practice them ourselves so that we respect those who are offering these prayers by not troubling them with making too much noise such that it's hard for them to focus on their prayers. This also gives the priest an opportunity to remove his vestments and offer his own prayers of thanksgiving before greeting people after Mass. But, I really do recommend these practices to everyone. Teach them to your children. This simple practice can greatly increase your intentional participation in the graces being offered in and through the supreme act of worship, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.
