Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

One of my favorite lines from a television show comes from *Star Trek: The Original Series*. In an episode entitled *This Side of Paradise* in season 1, Spock falls in love with an alien woman after being exposed to mind-altering spores from flowers on an alien planet (it was the 1960s after all). After he eventually recovers, he explains to the heart-broken alien woman why he cannot be with her. He explains that he has a responsibility to his ship and the captain. Then he goes on to give this fantastic line: "If there are self-made purgatories, then we all must live in them. Mine can be no worse than someone else's."

Everyone has their self-made purgatory or at least should have one. Such a comment may seem like a honest admission of a sad reality of life, one of those admissions that are said with a sigh of realistic acceptance. However, we should not be so hasty in our judgement.

To accentuate the readily apparent eccentricities of this bulletin blurb, let us bring Peter the Lombard into the conversation, the 12th century theologian, bishop of Paris, and compiler of patristic sayings in his famous *The Four Books of Sentences*.

Bishop Peter explains that, if someone has such contrition of heart and remorse for sin that it suffices to punish sin, then such contrition leads to eternal life, free of all penalties, even if their penance was incomplete. He goes on to explain that those who are not so bruised in heart and do not sufficiently groan so for sin must atone for their sins in purgatory if they depart before the completion of their penance. Moreover, they will suffer more grievously than if they had completed their penance here. As Sacred Scripture says: "it is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God."

The core of penitence is contrition and groaning in heart for our sins. Indeed, if we sufficiently groan in heart for our sins, our penance is complete through this groaning even if we have not completed the penances given to us or taken on by ourselves. We should groan in heart in this way and if our sorrow is lacking, we should do penance for our sins so that our atonement is proportionate to our offenses. In this way we satisfy justice and deepen our friendship with God in charity.

We ought to have a self-made purgatory. Many times, the circumstances of life or actions of other people create a purgatory for us. However, if they do not create a purgatory for us, then we need to create one for ourselves. We need to mourn our sins (Blessed are those who mourn!) and do penance. The goodness of atonement is the carrot that should draw us to penitence. If the carrot doesn't move us, then there is also a stick: "it is a fearful thing to fall into the hands
