

It's that time of year again to have a conversation about the manner of reception of Holy Communion. Myself and the other priests here have observed some issues that we hope can be resolved so that this moment of receiving Our Lord in his Sacramental mode of presence may be a moment of spiritual nourishment for all. Allow me to address a few points.

Here at Holy Rosary, we permit reception of Holy Communion either on the tongue or in the hand except for at the Dominican Rite Mass where these is no rubrical provision for reception in the hand. We kneel at the communion rail in either case unless infirmity impedes us from kneeling. Please remember that the first row of pews on the gospel side (north) of the nave is reserved for those who, due to infirmity, cannot approach the communion rail and those who care for them. If you are sitting behind this row and there are people sitting in that first row, please do not approach the communion rail until the priest has distributed communion to these people.

When wearing a mask we ask that you remove the mask prior to the reception of Holy Communion. This is common sense when receiving on the tongue but may not be when receiving on the hand. We ask that the mask is removed first to avoid dropping particles that may be on the hand. This means that those who receive in the hand ought to inspect their hands for particles before they leave the communion rail. This also means that people should receive communion at the communion rail before standing and departing.

There is also a pious custom of crossing one's self after receiving Holy Communion, which is beautiful. However, please ensure that the hand paten held by the server is no longer extended before making the sign of the cross. Also, when the communion veil is extended it is customary that one's hands are placed under the veil not above the veil. This is to help catch the Blessed Sacrament if Our Lord is accidentally dropped.

If you find yourself with one or both hands occupied, please receive on the tongue.

When receiving on the tongue here are a few best practices. First, stick out your tongue. It doesn't have to be a lot but sufficiently so that we can place the host on your extended tongue. Also, please relax your tongue. If your tongue is rigid it has a higher chance of causing an accidental drop. Please do not try to prematurely retract your tongue or point the tongue up and back. This does not secure the host but causes a high risk of a drop. Just keep the tongue relaxed. We will firmly place the host on your tongue and trust that it will remain in place. Also, please do not bite the host while we are trying to place the host on your tongue. And two last best practices, please don't lean forward toward the host, if anything lean back and relax and close your eyes, let the priest do the work.

Also, remember that in the Ordinary Form of the Roman Rite after the priest says, "the body of Christ" your response is "Amen." But, in the Dominican Rite of Mass, just like the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite, after the priest pronounces the "Corpus Domini nostri" there is no response made by the one receiving Holy Communion.

And, my last note about the proper reception of Holy Communion, other than the fact that we are not to receive

Holy Communion unless we are both in a state of sanctifying grace and properly disposed or not otherwise impeded, is that I've noticed something new that I think may be a result of wearing masks. More frequently people are breathing out while we are placing the host on their tongue. Please do not do this, there are many reasons why I could explain why this is a bad practice, but I'll just leave it at the instruction.

Thank you to everyone who desires to reverently receive our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament. As we worthily consume his most Precious Body and Blood, Soul, and Divinity, we come to be more conformed to him and are preserved in his grace so that we can live the Christian life faithfully.
