

Dear Parishioners:

Last summer I was asked to be a chaplain for a group of faithful Catholics on an expedition this coming February. We will be making an ascent of Mt. Kilimanjaro in Tanzania. As it is the tallest peak in Africa, it is one of the traditional Seven Summits (one for each continent). Though it is not a technical climb requiring special training and equipment, at 19,341' it's much higher than anything around these parts. Regardless, there is always danger of altitude sickness, low oxygen, and exhaustion.

To be chaplain involves celebrating the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass each and every day, hearing confessions, and God forbid, ministering the Anointing of the Sick or even Last Rites. And, if the conditions are exactly right, we hope to summit on a full moon and celebrate Mass there. It would be epic. We hope to be a witness and good example for other climbers and trekkers from all over the world.



Mt. Kilimanjaro is not unfamiliar to me as I did the ascent way back in 2003. Then, I was 19 years younger, more virile, and less wise. This time, however, I am an ordained priest and I'm excited to not just be a priest, but a Dominican priest. Naturally, there are a gazillion reasons why things will not work out the way I plan, and summiting is never a guarantee (and even getting there might be a challenge). But I like to think that I can lean on the prayers of the parishioners of Holy Rosary for some Divine Providence. Knowing that you all have "my back" will give us the extra oomph to make the ascent, that God will look kindly on this adventure, and that we will all be able to return home safely.

That said, I'd like to make a special request for you. Could you support this endeavor in any way you can, especially in prayer? Most of my expenses have been covered, so I'm not looking for that kind of support. But I would like to take this opportunity to raise awareness of the financial needs of our Dominican students in formation (essentially our seminarians). Getting one of them to ordination is an expensive undertaking. Would you be so kind as to pledge your financial support to my ascent on behalf of the student brothers? I will remember you all at Mass every day. Somehow doing this at elevations higher

than everywhere in Oregon is going to be glorious. More details will follow...
