

Dear Parishioners:

On the 5th Sunday of Easter we enter into what used to be called Passiontide, representing the last two weeks of Lent and the final stretch before the Easter event. In the gospel readings, taken from John, there is an increasing tension in the air, whether it is Jesus knowingly approaching the end of his early ministry, or the rising conflict between the chief priests and Jesus. This tension extends into our own contemplation as well as into our church building.

You will notice immediately upon entering the church that things are very different. We have taken the time to veil the crucifixes and images (all that could practically be veiled). The Stations of the Cross are never covered because they recount the Passion of Jesus Christ which is the whole point of Holy Week. Furthermore, it would be impossible and impractical to cover the stained glass (not to mention removing a great deal of our natural light).

While there are multiple historical accounts of why this is done and has been done since the Middle Ages, the most important implication for us in the here and now is that we can no longer gaze upon our familiar faces. They are veiled and blocked from view—thus giving us that aforementioned tension. This disposition heightens our sensitivity to the action of the Passion and helps us empathetically enter into the mystery of Salvation that Jesus Christ so gratuitously gives us. I encourage you all to come to our Church and spend some time in silent prayer and preparation, to join in any of our liturgies, or to have your confession heard. It is a beautiful time indeed, and one that can help us more fully understand the measures that God took on our behalf, and indeed how much he loves us.

Lastly, many of us have heard through the media good news regarding the pandemic. Multnomah County, as well as many of the surrounding counties, has moved into the moderate risk level, and things have started to open up more fully. We are not yet out of the woods, but this is very good news indeed. While the State of Oregon has never been a hot bed of either infections or death, our government did express a lot of caution. Here at Holy Rosary, we will be making some adjustments in the coming weeks, especially as the Archdiocese updates its guidance. We'll keep you posted.
