

Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

What do we do now?

Lent is over. Holy Week has passed. The Triduum is ended. Jesus Christ is Risen and his Octave has completed! So; now what? What do we do now that the vigor of our preparation has shifted to the dénouement of Eastertide?

Certainly what we must do is rejoice. We rejoice at the hope we are offered through Christ's triumph over suffering and death. By so doing we unite ourselves with His Resurrection just as rigorously as we unite ourselves with his Passion. This can be a challenge. The challenge comes from all sides. First, we are still living in a vale of tears. Second, we are still subject to the effects of Original Sin in our own souls. Third we are affected by the effects of Original Sin in the souls of others. With these challenges it's hard to muster the joy that Easter promises.

Regardless of the challenges to our Easter joy, we must look beyond them. Remember, the eyes of faith are able to see beyond the here and now. The eyes of faith are able to pierce the veil to some degree so that we can glimpse the hope of our future glory. This is what we must gaze upon in this time. When we are tempted to get lost in the mundane or despair over the state of the world you can remember that Christ has conquered the World. He has conquered death. He has conquered the Enemy. The entropy of society is to be expected. We read in the Sacred Scripture that things will continue to get worse until the end of time. This is why we must cling to that Glorious Hope just as tightly as we cling to that Holy Cross. Holding tight to these promises we keep our eyes fixed on that unfading crown that Christ has waiting for us in His Kingdom.

DEAR HOLY ROSARY FRIENDS AND FAMILIES,

As we continue bit-by-bit to put the pandemic and its effects behind us, we've restored more and more of our ministries and programs. Some of them, like all-day-adoration, were hit badly due the drop in numbers of people who could commit to daytime hours (over time that will hopefully change). Another thing that had gone fallow is the number of trained ushers and readers we have at the Vigil and Sunday Masses. It's been a long while since we've had a proper program for them.

It's easy to see both ushering and reading as impromptu tasks and we take them for granted. But they are far from that. Our priests are responsible for bringing the sacraments to the people but they cannot do so in a vacuum. Case in point, if we did not have servers or musicians our liturgies would be a very different (and sometimes illicit) act of worship. Our current readings of the Acts of the Apostles recount the building up of the early Church. Everyone pitched in to assist at the liturgy. It was a community event and it is no different today.

On May 21st at 10:00a please come to the Church and join me for a theological and practical reflection about these very important ministries. It is equally important for those who have done this in the past, for those interested in doing in going forward, and for those just interested in knowing more about the liturgy.
