Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

When I was first assigned to Holy Rosary I contacted a priest friend from the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest and in my excitement I asked him to pray that I did not become too attached to it so that when I was eventually reassigned that I would be able to do so with grace and peace. In his high pitched, French accent he told me that he refused. Rather, he would pray for the opposite so that my act of obedience will gain me more merit. I laughed. He was serious.

There is a fear of losing something that we love. But, as we grow in our relationship to God it becomes more and more certain that if we love any creature greater than the Creator then we are committing a form of idolatry. And yet, God permits us to love his creatures because he loves them. So, connections and separations are rightly filled with complex and deep emotions. Yet, even so, our eyes must remain fixed on the Master and his Holy Will.

When our superiors provide us with the opportunity to fulfill our vow of obedience it is an opportunity to show that love for God. We believe that the Holy Spirit is manifest in the authority they have over us. It is with that belief in mind that I announce that I will be leaving Holy Rosary to take up a new assignment given to me by the province and Bishop Solis to serve as the Pastor of St. Catherine of Siena Parish in Salt Lake City, UT. The transition will take a few months but will certainly be too short of a time. Replacing me will be a dear old friend of the parish and one of my own mentors, Fr. Paul Raftery. I'm sure there will be much joy to hear of his return.

It has indeed been a pleasure to serve you all in my first years of priesthood. You have formed me as much as I hope to have formed you in my time here. Pray that this new path, spread before me, will flower with the fruits of the Holy Spirit. You will remain in mine.

Our current readings of the Acts of the Apostles recount the building up of

the early Church. Everyone pitched in to assist at the liturgy. It was a community event and it is no different today.

It is equally important for those who have done this in the past, for those interested in doing in going forward, and for those just interested in knowing more about the liturgy.
