Dear Parishioners:

This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of Our Lord. This is that point in the gospels where Jesus Christ gives us the sign that heaven is available to us mere human beings. This is good news because signs bolster our Faith and point us in the right direction.

We have other reasons to celebrate as well. At our 9:00a Sunday Mass we have a number of children that will be making their first communion. This is a huge step in their lives and must be marked with great fanfare. In an age where things are taken so lightly, we need to emphasize our important milestones. For these young ones, receiving the Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ for the very first time is the culmination of years of longing. For when we consume Him, Jesus becomes part of us in an intimate and very real way. For God to condescend to us, especially in this manner, shows us how much he really does love us.

Even if you are not able to join us at this Mass, we all unite ourselves at the altar in the single most awesome event that Jesus Christ instituted for us, the intersection of Heaven and Earth, whenever we assist at any Mass. Please help us congratulate our new communicants and pray that they keep the Faith throughout their lives. It will be a beacon for them, as well as us, especially when we find ourselves lost and without direction.

Guidance from the Archbishop

Most of us are aware that the CDC, as well as the governor of Oregon, announced new guidelines regarding the wearing of masks and social distancing. This was in turn picked up Archbishop Sample. Henceforth, those who have been completely vaccinated for at least two weeks need not wear masks nor practice social distancing either indoors or outdoors on church property. Our response to this should be one of both relief and charity: one of relief because masks have been a burden (and a divisor) to all, and one of charity because those who have not received or finished their vaccination must still comply with earlier restrictions. St. Thomas Aquinas reminds us that we must always assume the good, that people are doing their best. It is not for us to judge the minds and souls of our neighbor. For that will lead us to a place where we don't want to go.


