Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

A couple of months ago while having some coffee and donuts in Siena Hall after the 7 AM Mass, a parishioner who had been attending Holy Rosary for twenty years told me he was a parishioner but have not registered. Surprised, I asked him why he had not registered. He countered by asking me to give him some good reasons why he should register in the parish. I gave him three reasons that came to my mind at the time. He found them to be very good reasons and registered the following week. In this week's bulletin, I would like to offer our parishioners five reasons to help you consider registering if you have not registered yet.

Besides simply giving the parish a way to connect with you, here are five tangible and practical reasons to register:

- When a parishioner comes to seek a letter from the pastor for a recommendation or to be a godparent, a pastor has to give proof that the parishioner is a registered, and active parishioner.
- 2. If parents would like their children to prepare to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion, or Confirmation, then proof of registration and sacramental participation is required to keep track of such information.
- 3. When a couple comes seeking to have marriage preparations, most pastors will ask if they or their parents are registered at the parish.
- 4. When there is a request for use of the Church such as for a wedding or funeral, many churches will have two recommended donation structures: one for visitors and one for registered parishioners.
- Although not common, I have had to search the registration database to look for the parents of a lost child in a church. In one instance, it was a big family, and the parents accidentally left one of their children at church.

To register at a parish means that we are making that parish our official spiritual home, a place where we have a sense of belonging, spiritual growth, and identity with that parish community. If you are coming to Holy Rosary regularly and feel at home here, I invite you to consider registering at Holy Rosary. Perhaps you are already registered but have recently changed your physical address or phone number, then you can update your information. You can register and update your information online at holyrosarypdx.org/registration.

You can also call Katie in the office if you would like to have someone assist you with registering, or updating your information. Holy Rosary church does not share the registration information with any governmental or law enforcement agencies.

In some countries, registering in one's parish is not common practice, and perhaps not necessary because parishioners are considered a part of the parish if they live within the territory of the parish. At Holy Rosary church, many of our parishioners live a long distance away, and our parish boundary is quite small. Registering at Holy Rosary will help us better understand the demographics of the parish, as well as help us in planning for the future needs of the parish.

### Construction Update and Fundraiser Announcement

As you probably know, we are in the middle of a construction project to replace our church's heating and cooling system. We thank you for your patience and are happy to report that the project is scheduled to be completed before Thanksgiving. This information update is our effort to be transparent. We want you to know about the decision process and how we intend to pay for this extensive renovation. Along with this, we are excited to announce the first of two planned fundraising events designed to help us address the financial costs of this project.

In 1894, Holy Rosary Church was moved to its present location by a team of horses and much ingenuity. Can you imagine the challenge of making that decision and then actually executing the work? Over the years our church, through the hard work and generosity of the clergy, lay staff and parishioners, has stepped up to not only meet present needs but to "pay forward" for their children and future generations.

### **Our Current Challenge**

In October, after 40 years of service, our heating and cooling system finally quit; and any further repairs would be a waste of valuable funds. As we look back, we are grateful to those who helped fund that HVAC system decades ago...likely, some of your relatives. We also are thankful for the ongoing work of our maintenance team, who help us extend "end of life" systems, making us good stewards of those past investments.

## What Are We Trying to Accomplish?

To give you an example, a typical home has a 2 to 3-ton furnace and doesn't need electrical or ductwork to be replaced. A home furnace alone may only be \$10,000, but an entire system could cost up to \$60,000. In the case of Holy Rosary, we needed a 30-ton system! We have a lot of cubic feet. To meet code, including fresh air requirements, this new system would need to be 10 times the size of an entire home revamp and 3 times larger than our now broken system. We also have to renovate our entire electrical and ductwork systems, add an OSHA attic access, and modify roof work. Finally, to gain a permit we added a structural engineer to make sure we didn't damage our infrastructure. All of this, plus we made a commitment to not aesthetically change our historic building.

#### How Did We Make Our Decision?

While our existing system was still operating, we entered into a request for information (RFI) process to learn from other churches that had successfully completed similar projects. Then we put out a request for proposal (RFP) to find the best partner. Getting competent bidders was difficult, especially, with such a complicated project during a pandemic. Next, we asked our chosen partner to provide a cost plus proposal. In others words, they provided us all of their equipment and labor invoice costs with agreed upon mark-up percentages. This unique agreement allowed us to choose the right company at the right price. After all of the negotiations, we came to a cost of approximately \$400,000. This was approved by Fr. Corwin, the business office, and the Province. Finally, dates were set to ensure the work was completed during the months when heating and cooling needs were minimal.

### **Project Summary**

We had an immediate need of a new HVAC system, and were prepared for that eventuality. We knew our desired solution and found a partner we could trust to successfully complete the project at a competitive price. This "state of the art" heating and cooling system will keep us warm in winter and cool in the summers, even at full capacity. Finally, like our predecessors, we are "paying it forward" for the next generations of parishioners.

### **How Can You Help?**

We're excited to be offering two fundraisers over the next six months to help us recover at least 10% of the project costs. Fortunately, we've been saving some money from your generosity and our rental properties to eliminate the need to borrow money. However, we now need your help to replenish our now depleted funds.
