Dear Parishioners:

On November 9th, the Archbishop of Portland in Oregon has issued his decrees concerning the implementation of the Motu proprio Traditionis custodes in his See. We should be extremely grateful for the gift that is our Archbishop. He has been extremely generous in his allowance for the celebration of the rites prior to the reforms of 1970. This affects us specifically, as a parish, in three areas that we should be aware of in our life as Catholics. While *Traditionis custodes* doesn't presently affect the celebration of the Dominican Rite of Mass it does affect the life of our faithful in very concrete ways.

The first way that it affects us is in the celebration of Holy Matrimony. Many of our young parishioners desire to solemnize their weddings according to the older rites. The Dominican Rite, being a monastic rite, doesn't have its own rite of Marriage. Because of this we have to rely on the use of the Roman Ritual to offer weddings according to the older forms. Many jurisdictions have restricted the use of the Roman Ritual to the point that weddings according to the older forms would be impossible, but that is not the case here.

The second way that it affects us is in the celebration of baptism. Again, many of our younger families enjoy the experience of having their children baptized according to the rites described in the Roman Ritual. Again, the Dominican Rite does not have its own version of baptism. As a result, we are dependent upon the rites described in the Roman Ritual. Archbishop Sample's solicitude allows us to continue the practice of baptizing children according to the older tradition of liturgical practice.

The third way this affects us is by way of blessings. Many people come to Holy Rosary because they know that we will bless objects according to the rites described in the Roman Ritual. This includes the exorcism of salt, oil, water, and the like. Without Archbishop Sample's solicitude toward us we would be relegated to the "blessings" described in the so-called Book of Blessings. The difference between the blessings in the Roman Ritual and the Book of Blessings are significant.

There is a fourth way that only applies to some people. These are those who are afflicted by extraordinary spiritual trauma. The Roman Ritual and related Rites provide great relief to those who are so afflicted. Due to the intervention of our Archbishop, we are able to continue this spiritual care unimpeded.

We live in a very complex and oftentimes confusing time in the Church. I pray that each of us see how we might grow in holiness in this time. Regardless of the difficulties that we might see, we also have a line of hope that is Christ and Him crucified. Praise be to Him, for He has triumphed over death and destruction for all times and for the ages to come.
