

Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

This past week, a parishioner asked if it was okay to make the Stations of the Cross during the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. The practice of the Stations of the Cross, also known as the Way of the Cross or Via Crucis, is a devotion that commemorates the Passion and death of our Lord Jesus Christ. It involves moving from station to station, each representing a specific event from Jesus' Passion, while meditating on that event.

The exposition of the Blessed Sacrament is another distinct liturgical practice where the Eucharist is displayed in a monstrance for adoration. During this time, the focus is on adoring Jesus present in the Eucharist. Holy Rosary Church currently has Exposition of the most Blessed Sacrament on weekdays from 12:30 p.m. until 4:00 p.m. Combining these two practices in the same space at the same time can be seen as problematic for several reasons:

Focus and Reverence: The primary purpose of the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament is adoration. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, the focus should be on adoring Jesus in the Eucharist. Moving around for the Stations of the Cross could be distracting for those who are there to adore the Eucharist.

Liturgical Norms: The Church has specific guidelines and norms for liturgical practices to ensure they are carried out with the utmost reverence and respect. For adoration of the Eucharist, there should be a spirit of silent prayer, although readings, hymns, recitation of the rosary, and reflections may also accompany it. Because the Via Crucis requires movement and its center of attention is elsewhere, it is incompatible with the simultaneous exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in the same body of the church.

Practical Considerations: Since moving from station to station could be disruptive, especially for those present during adoration, I recommend meditating internally on the Stations of the Cross, without moving around. This would be a meditation on the Passion rather than making the Way of the Cross. As the name implies, the Way of the Cross implies movement. For those who would like to make the Via Crucis privately at Holy Rosary church, consider making the Stations before the noon Mass between 8:00 a.m. and 11:30 am.

While the Stations of the Cross and the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament are venerable practices in the Catholic Church, care should be taken to ensure each is given its due reverence and focus. Combining them in the same space at the same time is not ideal, and it's essential to consider each devotion's liturgical norms and purpose.
