Dear Parishioners:

By now I'm sure that some of you have heard about the opening of the two year process leading up to a special Synod of Bishops that will itself discuss the concept of synodality. If this is news to you then I would recommend checking out the reporting done at The Pillar where JD Flynn and Ed Condon have discussed the issue both in print and on their podcast. Regardless, the question we should ask ourselves is whether this process is something that we might use to help us preach the Gospel more readily in our current cultural climate.

Synodality is nothing new in the Church. It's a formal process of consultation. The innovation is the scope of this current process. Historically, synods were more limited in scope and generally regional. An attempt to cast such a large net has never been tried. But, with modern means of communication it may be possible and potentially fruitful. What we should seek to do is enter into the process at the local level to the degree that we are able to aid the Archbishop and the Dominican Order to provide a positive contribution so that our needs and desires as a parish can be represented. To help facilitate this I would suggest that everyone pay close attention to the communications coming from the communications arm of the Archdiocese of Portland. You can sign up to receive their email newsletter on their website. This will be the most efficient way to stay informed about how this process will be implemented in our Archdiocese.

I spoke to the Archbishop about this synodal process recently and he is hoping to use the local consultative process to help him serve Western Oregon more effectively. This will only be possible to the degree that we willingly and prayerfully participate, relying on the Holy Spirit to enlighten our minds for the sake of the mission of our local Church. So, while we may hear things about the process that are cynical we should not cause this to distract us from the good that we can achieve through this opportunity.
