Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

We are quickly arriving at two major solemnities of the liturgical year: All Saints and All Souls. There are signs all around the city of the impending feasts because we see all the different Halloween decorations that always precede them.

All Souls Day (Día de los Muertos) has a special place in my heart. I was fortunate enough to be born on this day and I get to have my cake and enjoy the Dies Irae too. The happy coincidence of my birthday being on All Souls provides me a very powerful reminder: Memento mori—remember death. I would often spend part of my birthday in the cemetery.

An important part of Catholic culture is praying for the dead. In our age of celebrations of life and pre-mature canonizations at funerals, many Catholics have the impression that praying for the dead is not necessary. However, praying for the dead is an important expression of Christian charity.

We pray for the dead to aid the souls in purgatory with our prayers. We read in the Catechism of the Catholic Church:

All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven... The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned. (CCC 1030-1031)

Many people end up in purgatory after death to undergo purification before they can enter heaven. Just as our prayers can help obtain for people still alive the graces they need for their growth in the spiritual life, so too can our prayers so benefit the holy souls in purgatory in their purification.

We need to habitually pray for the holy souls in purgatory and offer Masses for them. I am pleased to say that we will have many additional Masses offered at Holy Rosary for the souls in purgatory—four extra Masses by my count. The times for the additional Dominican Rite Low Masses on All Souls (November 2nd) are: 5AM, 5:30AM, and 5PM (as well as our usual 6AM, 7AM, and 12PM). At 7PM we will have our Solemn High Requiem Mass with music by Cantores in Ecclesia. These extra Masses are possible because each priest can celebrate three Masses on All Souls Day for the faithful departed. Such a generous permission should underscore for us the importance of praying for the dead.

May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. - Fr. Joseph Selinger, OP
