Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

Despite the criticism of some protestant denominations, the Holy Rosary is a prayer profoundly focused on Jesus Christ. Nobody knows Jesus better than His Blessed Mother and the events of Jesus' life come alive when we try to view these events through His mother's eyes.

Mothers have a unique connection to their children, a connection that is more immediate than a child's connection to their father. The child is at one point physically united to their mother and the child's own sense of personal identity first develops when it gains the capability to perceive the difference between itself and its mother.

The child's union with its mother and its eventual recognition of its own personal identity in distinction to her provides the fundamental psychological basis by which the child recognizes itself an independent being able to have relationships with others, the first of which is its mother and the second of which is its father. The mother also has a unique connection with her child, both different from the child's relation to her and the father's relation to the child. No adult can have a more intimate union with another than the mother has with her child, given that the child had a physical unity with her despite its independent existence and dignity. The child is part of the mother's good, which is why abortion (among other reasons) is such an evil for both child and mother—abortion at any stage of pregnancy is contrary to the natural office of motherhood and thus a profound violation of the natural law.

Despite the difference between mother and child as two unrepeatable individuals, a child retains a unique connection with its mother throughout life. There is always a latent recognition of that previous physical and psychological union between the two an echo that remains throughout life that constitutes the continued uniqueness of their relationship.

Jesus was born of a virgin and conceived by the Holy Spirit. Joseph was a foster father of Jesus and God the Father was the real Father. Jesus is the real Incarnate Son—the second person of the Holy Trinity. Nonetheless, Jesus was human in all things but sin. The body of the God-man went through the normal course of human development, albeit free from the harmful effects of original sin and in relation to a mother who was immaculately conceived as thus sinless.

Jesus' development was perfect, but it nonetheless involved the same unique kind of union with His mother as part of His development as we all have. There is truly a difference between our mutual relationship to our mothers and the relationship between Jesus and Mary, insofar as Jesus is the incarnate Son of God and Mary is the immaculately conceived Mother of God. However, we should not stress the difference between the union of Mary and Iesus and our relation to our mothers to the extent that we undermine the humanity of Christ. An echo of that union between mother and child would have been, as it is for all of us, a latent part of Jesus' personality and the personality of His mother. That mutual union between Mary and Jesus that continues throughout their life conditions their perception of each other. The Holy Rosary allows us to enter this connection as visitors to see Jesus through the eyes of His mother. When we pray the Rosary, we meditate on the events of Jesus' life and gain insight to the emotional resonances of these events in the Heart of Mary, immaculate and pierced with swords. When we enter this connection between Jesus and Mary, we come away from our visit transformed. Our mind is filled with the loving perception of Jesus'

life through the tender eyes of His mother and our encounter with the emotions of her Immaculate Heart stirs many emotions in us that are profitable for the spiritual life.
