Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

producing religious diversity, commanding religious diversity, or even counseling us to be religiously diverse. God does will differences in religion in the sense of *permitting* differences in religion, just as He permits so many different evils to bring about a greater good. After the sin of Adam, God scattered humanity throughout the earth where they strived and searched for God, whom they lost due to the sin of their progenitor. Due to human weakness and sin, different religions arose, which contained different truths about God and the world but also many errors. God did produce the truths in other religions, insofar as truth can only come from Christ who says: "I am. . . the Truth." (John 14:6). For this reason, the Church does not reject these elements of truth found in other religions (Nostra *Aetate*, 2). However, the Church *does* reject the many errors and superstitions that burden pagan religions and make them unpleasing to God. Hence, God does not produce these religions as such, taken as involving both their truths and

God does not will differences in religion in the sense of

God has willed only one religion, Catholic Christianity, in the sense of producing it. God produced the Catholic religion when he created the natural order, which amounts to a natural law commanding true worship and forbidding superstition. He produced the Catholic religion when he revealed Himself, redeemed mankind, and founded a Church on the rock of the Blessed Apostle Peter. He produced the Catholic religion when He established the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, in which true worship is given to God through the representation of the sacrifice of Christ on Calvary. Such a view of religious diversity is required if we are to be authentic as Catholics. People today, especially young people, value authenticity. We do not want to see some institution presenting itself as something it is not, which would happen if we portrayed God as willing all religions. One calls to mind the Mormon effort to present themselves as a variant of mainline Christianity, the hypocrisy of much televangelism, or even the trendy mainline Christian denominations which abandon their controversial teachings to please the multitude.

Sometimes I can respect an institution which holds to false beliefs but presents an accurate picture of itself and has continuity with its historical origin. I cannot respect an institution that either lies about itself or changes like the wind, blowing this way or that. It makes me think: how could they possibly maintain that their 1st century CE scriptures contain a message which sounds like it comes from 21st century Berkeley, California? Hermeneutical acrobatics! Christianity sinks or floats with the question of authenticity. For example, Joseph Ratzinger once commented that, if we think that belief in the resurrection simply means that we carry on Christ's political views to a new generation, isn't it more honest to admit that we have reached the end of the line?

The future of Christianity requires a robust orthodoxy, rooted in tradition, but responding to contemporary challenges. We need to accept and appreciate the gift we have received in the Catholic faith and not shamelessly portray the faith as one choice among many other equally valid options.
