Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time Dominican Rite: Nineteenth Sunday after Pentecost Coffee and Doughnuts after morning Masses

Dear Parishioners:

Tradition tells us that the Blessed Virgin Mary gave the Rosary to St. Dominic. From there, the brethren, mostly through the efforts of Blessed Alan de la Roche, have tirelessly promoted its use. Throughout the centuries the Church continues to recognize it as the most important devotional prayer we can use.

Pope St. Pius V attributed the successful defense of the Christian West against the attack of the Ottoman Turks to the intervention of Our Lady through the recitation of the Rosary. If they had lost, it is entirely possible that the United States would not be a Christian nation. As such, the Church commemorates this great event on the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary on October 7th (For this reason, the feast used to be called Our Lady of Victory).

At Holy Rosary this is our titular feast. Thus, we celebrate it on the nearest Sunday, which is October 10th this year. But, did you know that at Holy Rosary we have a public recitation of the Rosary almost every day? Yes! On weekdays at 11:30a and on Saturdays at 7:30a we say the Rosary just before Mass in the traditional manner of the Dominicans (do not worry, it's not substantially different and there's a card in the pews with it spelled out).

If my schedule permits I lead it. It's a wonderful time to pray together and to contemplate on the mysteries of the life of Jesus and of Mary. Plus, we can also use this time to pray for our intentions either those of thanksgiving or for special needs. Remember, God always answers our prayers. But we must be receptive to the answer he gives. Come pray with me!


MARIAN RETREAT DAY WITH ABP. SAMPLE
